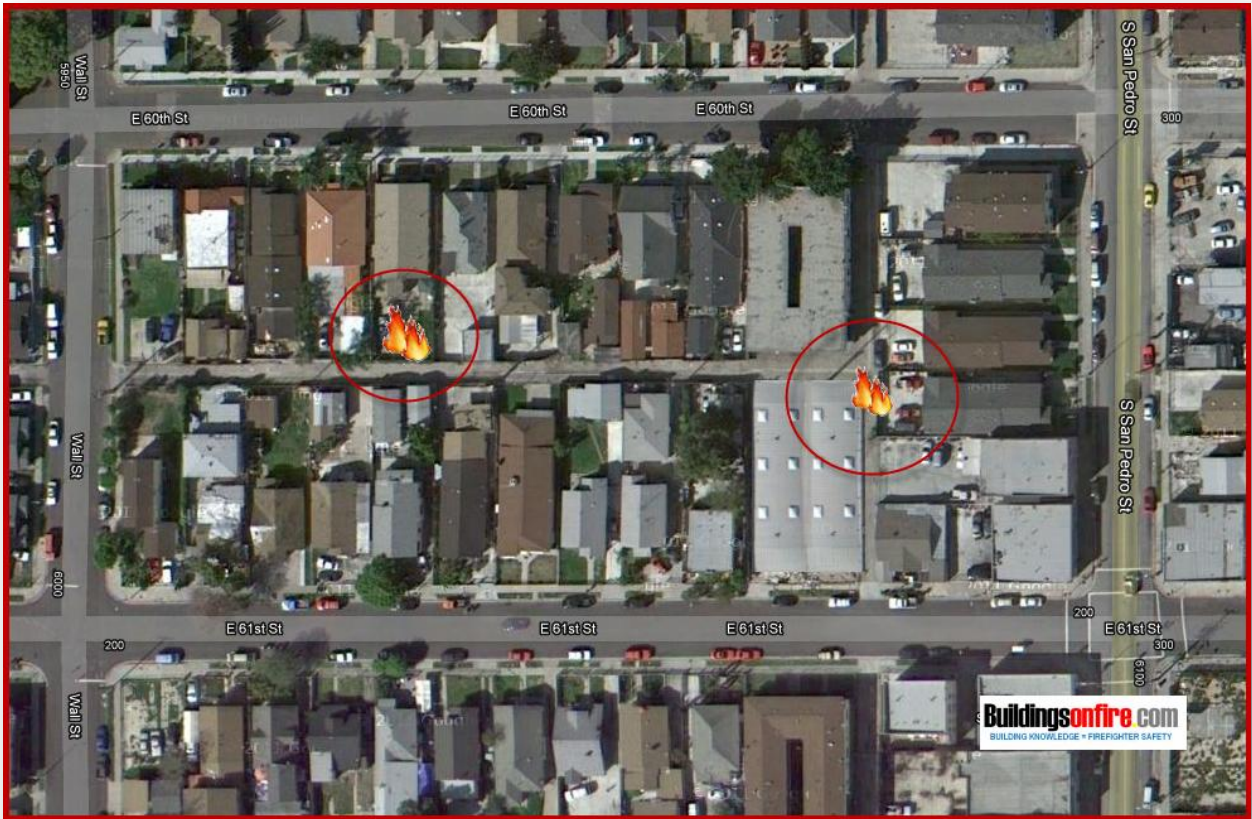

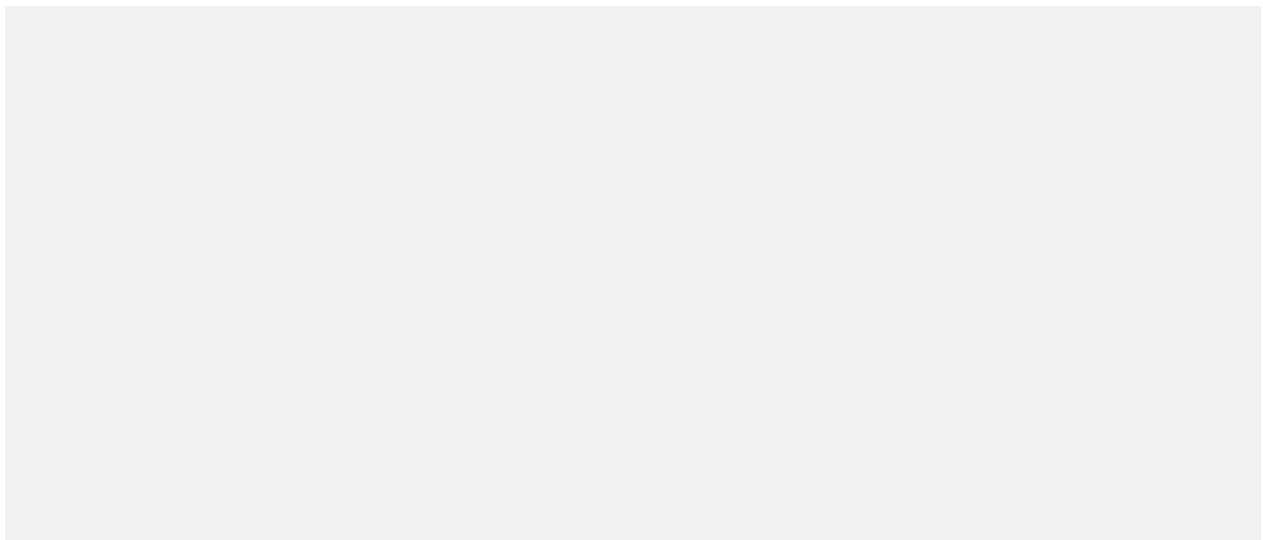

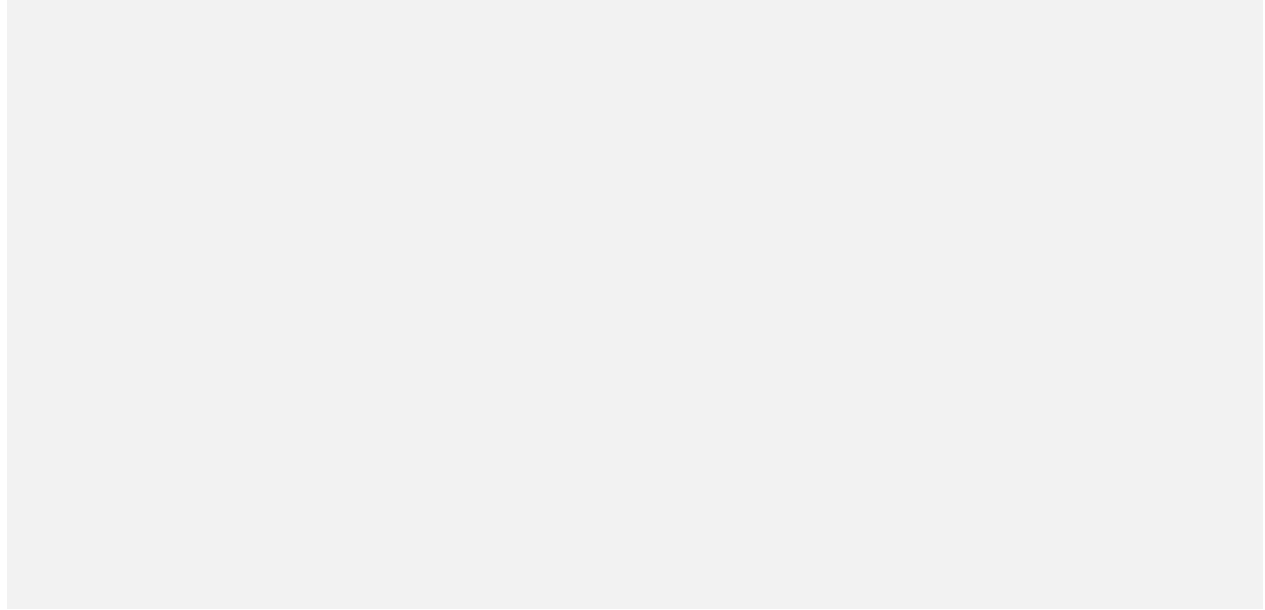
Aerial of the Block Area and the Two Fire Locations
An Alley way runs parallel to E 60st and E 61st Streets



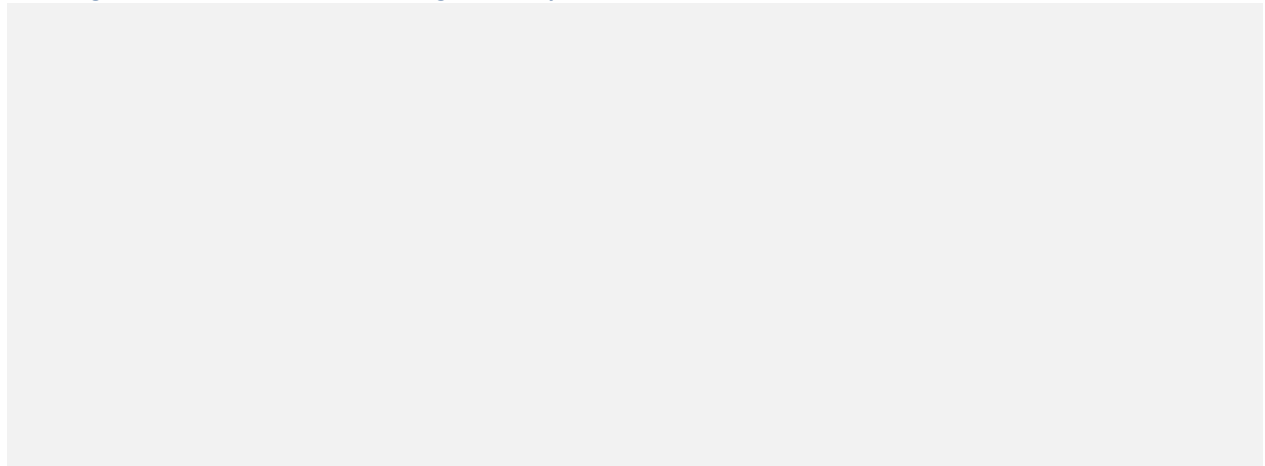

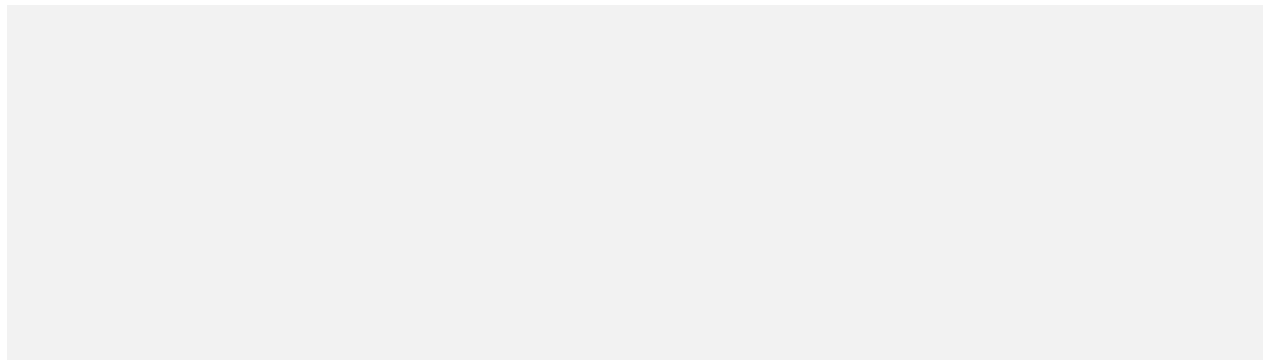
